We are Australian Gas Infrastructure Group (AGIG)

One of Australia's largest gas infrastructure businesses. We deliver gas to more than two million customers across every Australian mainland state and the Northern Territory, through 36,000km of distribution networks, 4,300km of gas transmission pipelines and via 60 petajoules of gas storage capacity.



MGN owns and operates gas distribution infrastructure in Victoria.



DBP owns and operates Western Australia's principal gas transmission system the Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline. The Australian Gas Infrastructure Development (AGID) Group operates unregulated transmission pipelines, gas processing, storage and small quantities of native gas production in Western Australia and the Northern Territory.



AGN owns gas infrastructure (distribution and transmission pipelines) in Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, New South Wales and the Northern Territory. It also owns and operates two renewable hydrogen production facilities, Hydrogen Park South Australia and Hydrogen Park Gladstone, with a third facility, Hydrogen Park Murray Valley, under construction in Victoria.

Hero Hunter Foundation

In 2025, we were proud to partner with the Hero Hunter Foundation, a Perth-based charity dedicated to supporting families of children living with cancer and serious blood disorders. The Foundation provides vital practical and emotional assistance during what is often one of the most challenging times in a family's life.

Our funding helped to deliver wellbeing massages to parents and carers spending long periods in hospital caring for their children. St Mary's House of Welcome

St Mary's House of Welcome, located in Fitzroy, Victoria, provides vital support to people experiencing homelessness, social disadvantage and complex mental health challenges - helping some of the most vulnerable members of the community to feel safe, supported and connected. The centre provides practical assistance, including meals, showers, clean clothes, and access to specialist services such as legal support and emergency relief.

In 2025, AGIG was proud to support the charity's Look Good, Feel Good Program, which provides hygiene products, clothing, access to dental care, and hot showers and laundry facilities. This program helps people maintain their wellbeing and dignity.

Tips for Completing Your Application

- Be clear and concise – explain what your project is, what you want to achieve and why it matters.
- Show your impact – outline how you will measure success (eg. number of people supported, skills gained, awareness raised).
- Align with AGIG – demonstrate how your project supports AGIG's Values and focus areas.
- Be transparent about funding – describe exactly how the requested funds will be used.
- Identify your beneficiaries – specify who will benefit (eg. young people, regional communities, vulnerable households).
- Include any supporting information (if relevant).

Before Submitting, Please Check

- You are a registered charity or not-for-profit organisation.
- All sections of the application form are completed (max 200 words per question).
- Your budget and outcomes are clear and achievable.
- Contact details for your organisation and project lead are included.
- You have included any relevant supporting material (optional).

How to Submit Your Application

Once complete, please email your application form to communitypartnerships@agig.com.au by the closing date to be considered for the current round of funding.

We will acknowledge receipt of your application and be in touch following the assessment process.
